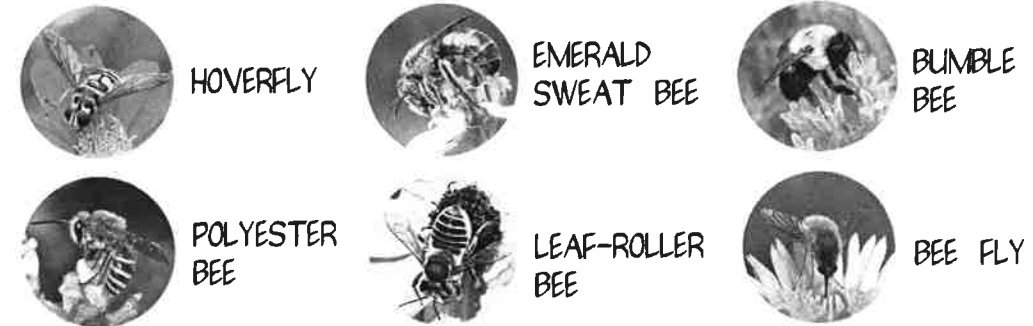


NATIVE POLLINATORS

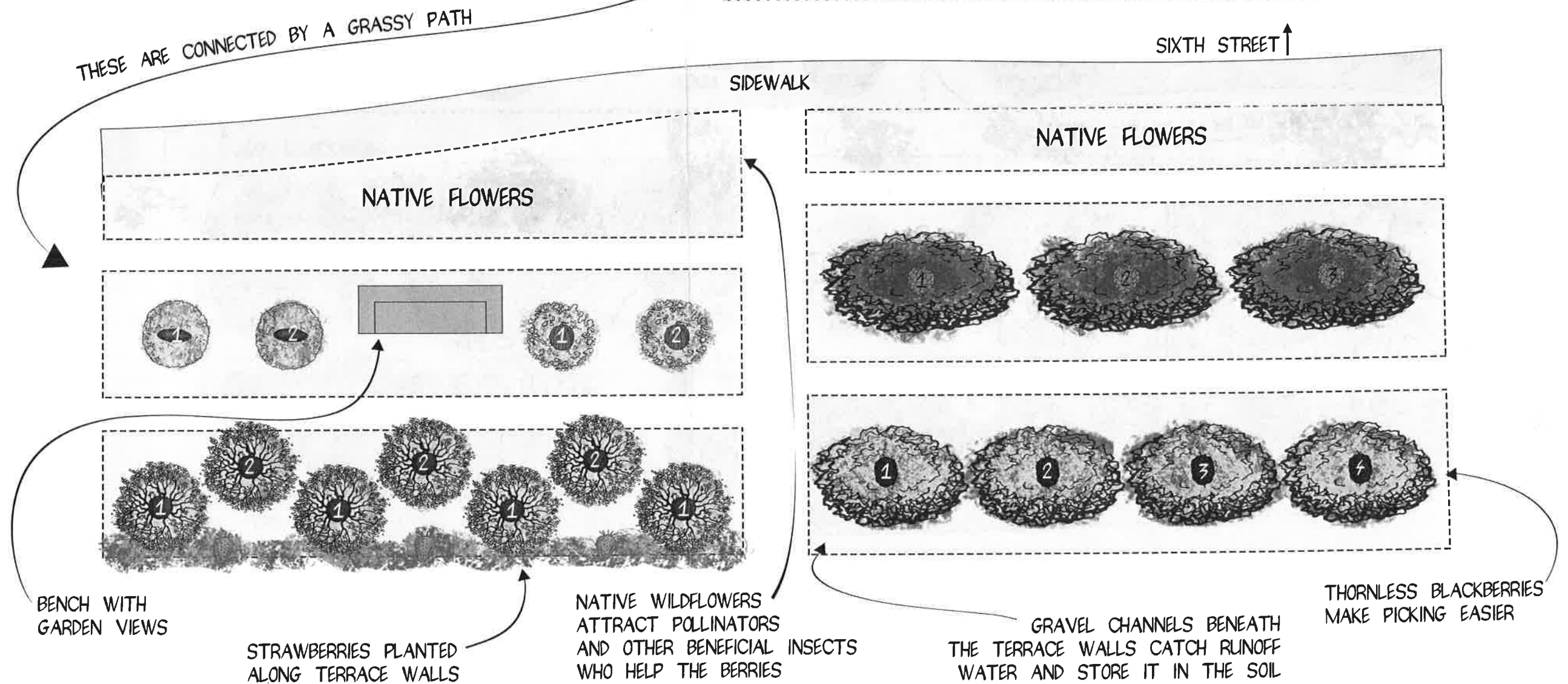

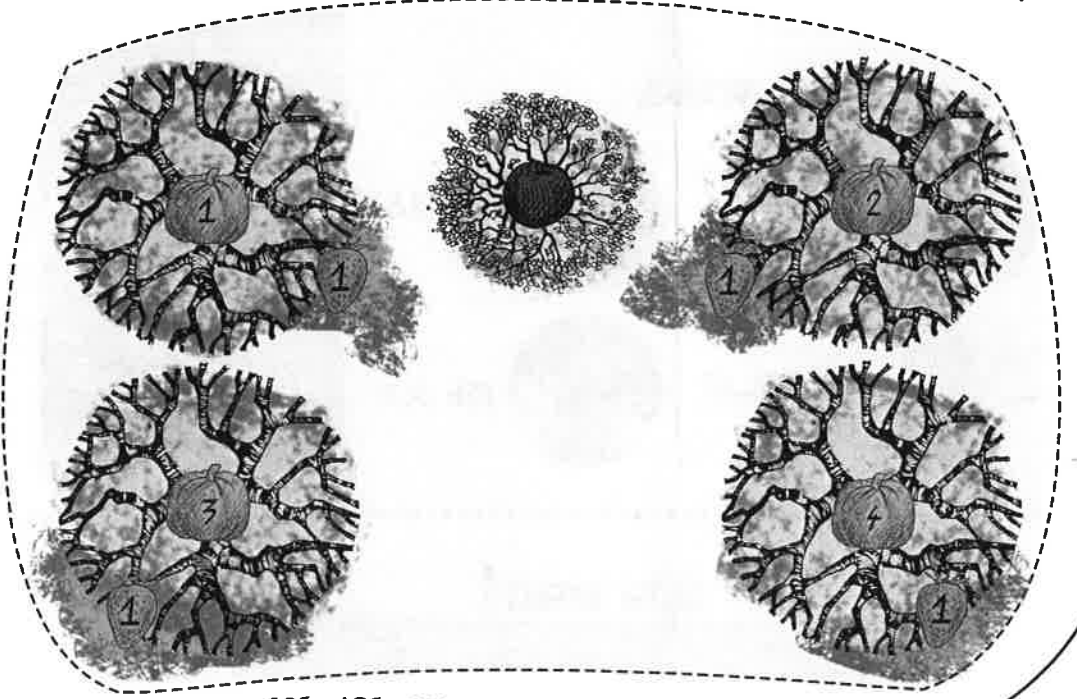

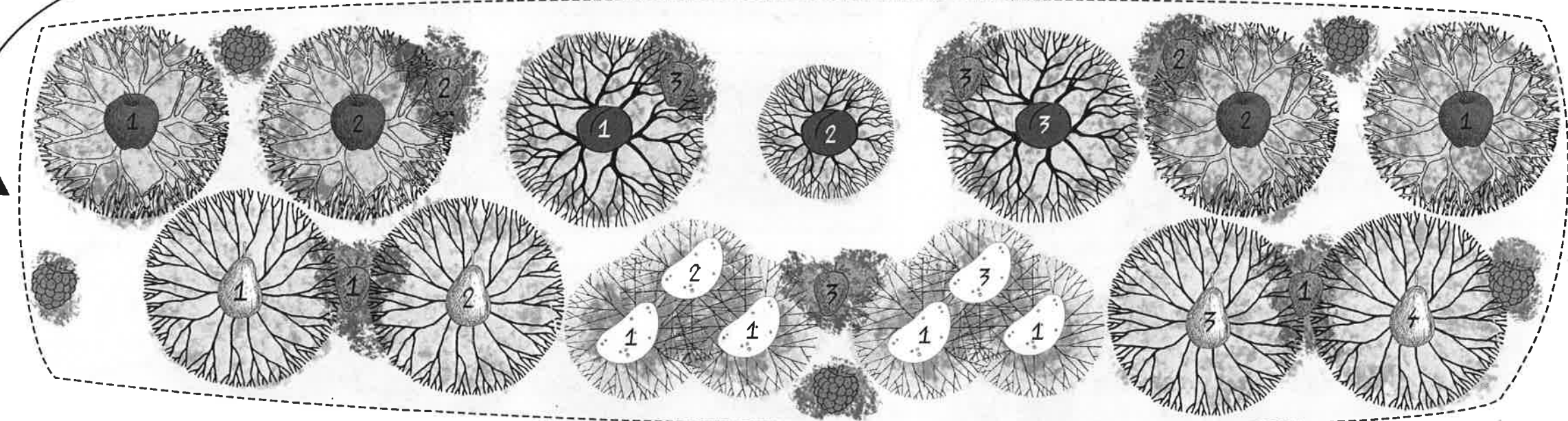
